Official Announcement Admission Process Public and Private Medical and Dental Colleges for the session 2022

As per the Pakistan Medical Commission Act 2020 and the Pakistan Medical Commission Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admissions, Curriculum and Conduct) Regulations 2021 the following Eligibility for Admission shall apply to ALL Public and Private medical and dental colleges;

- Only students having passed the MDCAT 2021 examination obtaining 65% or more marks are eligible for admission. There are no exceptions in any public or private medical & dental college across Pakistan
- Students who have obtained more than 65% marks in their equivalenced MDCAT 2020 exam are also eligible for admission.
- Students are required to submit the list of colleges they have applied to at <u>https://pmc.gov.pk/Results/ForwardCollegeResults</u> for forwarding their verified MDCAT scores to the colleges.
- A student must have obtained 65% or more aggregate marks in their F.Sc., A levels or other equivalent HSSC qualification. IBCC certificate for equivalence to F.Sc. shall be required for A Level or other equivalent qualification holders.

Following are Deadlines for Admissions. No admission after these dates shall be registered with PMC;

Following criteria for calculation of Merit shall be applied by ALL colleges;

Pursuant to the decision of the Ministry of Education, the PMC Council decision (dated 25th June 2021) related to the Ministry of Education's decision and the Memorandum of 16th August 2021, No. F.4-Sec.PMC-2020/Merit calculation/034, all public and private colleges/universities when calculating the merit for admissions must ensure that;

- Only marks obtained in three elective science subjects: Biology, Chemistry and Physics (Mathematics only if Physics not taken) in F.Sc., A-level or an equivalent HSSC qualification be used.
- Only the actual marks obtained in the elective subjects by the applicants in their F.Sc. or A-level or an equivalent HSSC qualifications results must be used. Institutions must NOT consider any grace marks added by any authority to the elective subjects.

Following Admission Process shall be followed by Private Colleges;

- No college shall charge an application fee of more than Rs.1,000 from a student when applying for admission. No other charges for prospectus, interview fee etc. should be charged. If any such fee has been charged the same must be reimbursed to the students.
- A college after receiving and processing all applications and conducting any interview if part of its admission criteria shall upload only one Final Merit List of ALL students who have applied for admission. There shall be no additional merit lists.
- Students shall have the right to accept the offer for admission as per their merit by payment of fee. Failure to accept admission shall allow the student next in line to accept the admission.
- A student who has been assessed as eligible for the grant of scholarship under the PMC National Scholarship Program or any other scholarship program and presents a certificate of eligibility at the time of acceptance of admission shall be required to pay only the college fee in addition to the scholarship value approved for the student. The college shall notify the PMC or other scholarship granting entity of the admission of the student and the scholarship value shall be paid to the college directly within 30 days of admission being notified.
- Each college shall display on its website after issuance of the Final Merit a daily update of students who have accepted their offers and the number of seats remaining vacant to allow students next in line to accept their offer.
- No student shall be allowed to accept admission out of turn as per merit.

Special Provision for Students with Delayed F.Sc. or A Level results.

- Any student who has applied for admissions but their F.Sc. or A Level result is delayed due to late exams shall be considered for admission subject to such result being available prior to 10th February 2022.
- A college shall retain a list of all such students and an equal number of seats from the bottom of the allocated seats shall be held on a provisional basis.
- Students who have applied with their results available shall be admitted on a Provisional Basis only on such seats till 10th February 2022.
- If a student with a delayed result submits their result before 10th February 2022 and on calculation is higher in merit than the last student on the admitted list, they shall be given admission and the provisional admission to the earlier student shall be cancelled. A student who has paid the fee against a provisional admission shall have their fee refunded in full.
- If no candidate with delayed results submits before 10th February 2022, the provisional admissions shall be finalized.
